GLOBAL CONNECTIONS

Lunar New Year

In February, Navy Pier transformed its Aon Grand Ballroom into an immersive celebration of the Year of the Dragon. 4,200 guests enjoyed traditional and contemporary performances from local Asian artists, food from local vendors, and interactive arts and crafts activities.

International Carnivale

Navy Pier's International Carnivale represents traditions from the more than 50 countries that celebrate Carnivale worldwide. In 2024, the Pier presented 2,500 attendees with art-making activities, food, and performances from across Latin America, the Caribbean, Europe, and North America.



The Global Connections Series continued in 2024, bringing free cultural festivities from around the world to Navy Pier. In partnership with ComEd, Navy Pier welcomes guests of all backgrounds each year to celebrate Lunar New Year, International Carnivale, Holi, and Mexico Fest.

Holi

Navy Pier hosts Chicago's largest Holi celebration each year, gathering 6,200 attendees in 2024. Alongside live performances by Chicago-based Indian dance companies, musicians, and DJs, guests celebrated the Hindu holiday with powder throwing in Navy Pier's Beer Garden.

Mexico Fest

In May, Navy Pier partnered with the General Consulate of Mexico in Chicago and the Governments of Chihuahua, Nayarit, and Querétaro to host its weekend-long Mexico Fest. The event included a 30+ vendor mercadito experience, art workshops, and performances from local Mexican artists.

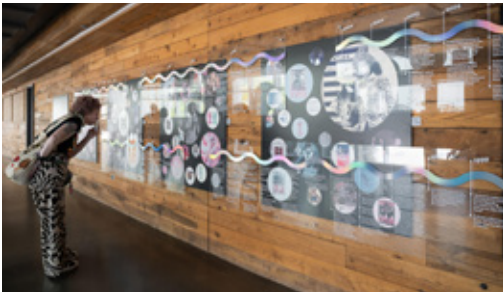

SPRING 2024

Five sphere sculptures reaching up to two meters in diameter were displayed at the Peoples Energy Welcome Pavilion for twelve days in May in connection with Mexico Fest 2024. The spheres were crafted and painted by the most renowned potters of Mata Ortiz, a city in Chihuahua, Mexico, and displayed figures and images from the city’s culture.

Curated by the Design Museum of Chicago and the Vintage House Show Collective, *Chicago: Home of House* illustrated the history of Chicago House music, paying homage to the young Black and Latino artists who pioneered the genre.



EXPO CHICAGO

APRIL 2024

The 11th edition of EXPO CHICAGO drew 35,000 visitors across the four-day art fair. The annual event featured 170 leading art galleries from 29 countries and 75 cities. It also included public panel discussions between artists, art directors, and other arts professionals.



To Sit A While

SUMMER 2024

To Sit a While, a permanent gift to Navy Pier from the Lorraine Hansberry Initiative, celebrates the life and work of playwright and civil rights leader Lorraine Hansberry. Located in Polk Bros Park, it features a figure of Hansberry surrounded by five life-size bronze chairs and invites the public to pause with her and reflect.

SUMMER 2024

Towards by artist Samuel Stubblefield tells the stories of Americans who work to make a positive difference in their communities and country. The project merges instrumental music, spoken word interviews, and videos of interviewees displayed on five LED walls.



CHICAGO LIVE

The largest free performing arts festival in the Midwest returned for its fourth year with an incredible lineup of Chicago's best theater, music, and dance, including event headliner Jeff Tweedy. Celebrating Chicago's vibrant arts and cultural scene, this free event proudly presented a record-breaking 110 performances across the Pier over two days.

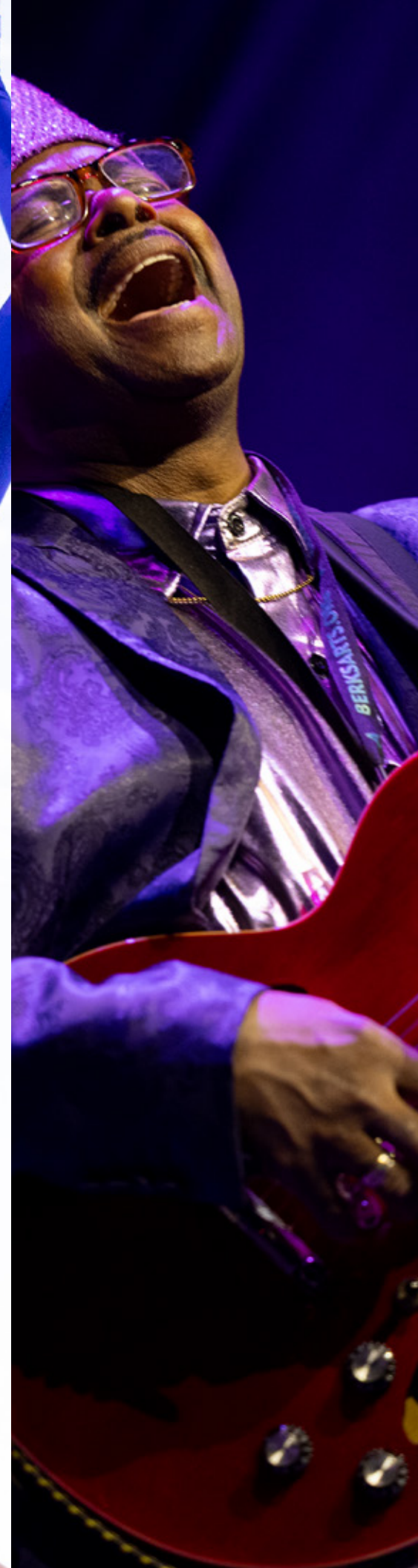

DISFEST AT CHICAGO LIVE!

In 2024, Navy Pier partnered with disability performing arts organization ReinventAbility to present DisFest at Chicago Live!, making this edition the most accessible festival to date. Complimentary services for guests with disabilities included an accessible shuttle, a low-sensory respite space, and ASL interpretation on multiple stages.

This year’s DisFest performances included music by Calculated Discomfort, acts by Tellin’ Tales Theatre, and dancing from Momenta Dance Company.

NAVY PIER SMALL BUSINESS ACCELERATOR PROGRAM

2024 marked the launch of the Navy Pier Small Business Accelerator Program. Presented by BMO and produced in partnership with Sunshine Enterprises, the program featured three main objectives:

- Equip small business owners with essential skills in e-commerce, financial forecasting, and marketing
- Facilitate networking connections between vendors, industry experts, and potential partners
- Provide vendors with a premier platform to showcase and sell their products to a broad audience at Navy Pier’s 2024 Holiday Markets

Ten local vendors were empowered to elevate and grow their businesses. This comprehensive program provided training, networking, and a platform for these entrepreneurs to showcase and sell their products at Light Up The Lake’s holiday artisan marketplace.
